The Skin of Color Society (SOCS) hosted its 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Skin of Color Society Scientific Symposium on Thursday, March 24, 2022, at the Omni Boston at the Seaport Hotel, Ensemble EFG, in conjunction with the 2022 AAD Annual Meeting. The day began with the Annual General Business Meeting and the President's Report by Dr. Donald A. Glass was followed by a full program of invited speakers and medical student/resident and research fellow oral presentations.

# COMMITTEE REPORTS

SOCS committees reported on their activity over the past year. Exciting new initiatives were discussed, some of which included: growth of our membership numbers, record applications and activity of the mentorship program, a record number of meeting participation via abstracts and registrants, media engagement increases, a significant increase in sponsorship support, as well as the continued growth of collaborations with industry. The President also reported on new business and updates including the launch of the new online learning management system (LMS) called Dermatology E-Learning + Equity Platform (DEEP) and the announcement that the SOCS strategic plan was finalized in quarter one of 2022 and implementation of the 5-year plan will begin in 2022.
